



New temporary stand for 2019



Clapton CFC members and supporters now have a roof to keep the rain off after the new temporary stand at the Stray Dog was installed.

The 20m x 3m structure was fitted to the right of the dugouts at our temporary home just before the Christmas period.

Up to now, spectators have been reliant on gazebos, umbrellas and hoods to keep dry after a run of unseasonably rainy weather.

The next stage will be to add boxes to provide steps so people at the back can see over the heads of those at the front.

The decision to install the temporary stand came after a full members vote with 89% of respondents voting yes.

As a temporary structure, all materials can be-used and moved to another ground, should we decide as members to relocate the club.

The stray cats of the Stray Dog

A colony of stray cats who had been living at the Stray Dog have been rescued and rehomed before Christmas.

Supporters had noticed the feline friends hanging out behind the goal at the far end at home games and during clean-up sessions.

It turned out kind-hearted neighbours and staff at Matchday Centre had been feeding them – just 1 or 2 at first, but the colony quickly grew and grew.

There were increasing concerns for the cats as the nights started to get colder, darker and wetter. So in October, we called Cats Protection. Their volunteer Claire first checked they weren't owned by any nearby residents. They were then all taken away, neutered, vaccinated, defleaed and dewormed.

Happily all eight of them have settled into new homes in time for Christmas – including two who have returned to live permanently with neighbours. So you may still see them popping back to the Stray Dog now and then.



Clapton slumped to a heavy defeat at home to Ealing Town, in brutal December weather.

The result means they go into the new year placed seventh in the league, albeit with games in hand on those above them.

In farcical circumstances, the game almost didn't happen at all.

The away side's kit somehow went astray on its way to the Stray Dog, failing to arrive by kick off. When it did finally show up, there was no time to complete a full game before darkness fell.

Clapton CFC were entitled to take the win by default, but agreed to play a shortened game of thirty minutes a half

There was reason to be confident, coming off the back of a 2-1 away win at The Curve with what Geoff Ocran described as one of CCFC's strongest ever matchday squads.

The Tons were able to field strike duo Sherwin Stanley and Eliot Crosbie together for the first time in almost a month. Centre back Andrew Lastic was deployed at right back.

An incredible 259 dedicated fans endured the cold, wind and rain in the last game before The Stray Dog's temporary stand is erected.

The opening exchanges saw decent chances at both ends. The Ealing keeper saved a smart Stefan Nielsen shot with his feet in the first minute.

Then, an Eagles attacker took the ball round Tons keeper Vlad Bendovskyy and slotted home only to be adjudged to be offside.

On 11 minutes, Lewis Owiredu swung the ball in from the left. It dropped perfectly onto the head of an unmarked Stanley, who nodded into the corner from close range.

Ealing almost equalised directly from the restart, when they again rushed through on goal. Bendovskyy stood up to make a super stop.

Then came a real turning point in the match.

Crosbie chased a through pass. The Ealing defender was favourite, but was bullied off the ball. The

Clapton hotshot tried to casually slot it under the keeper but an Ealing defender managed to get back onto the line to clear.

After that great chance, Clapton's grip on the game completely slipped away.

The West London side were playing with a speed and skill with which the Tons were struggling to cope. Above all, their deadly finishing made the difference.

On 20 minutes, Jordan Rocca beautifully curled the ball over Bendovskyy from the angle of the box to equalise. Ten minutes later, Emile Libock broke through with a nice one-two and slotted in (to make the score one-two).

The half time break was shortened in an attempt to chase the last of the day's natural light.

Aside from a Stanley snapshot that flashed just past the post, there was not much to trouble the opposition goal.

Halfway through the second period, the Eagles stretched their lead when an outrushing Bendovskyy was chipped. Walid Hirsi was in the right place to tap in.

Shortly afterwards, Bendovskyy again rushed out to try to deal with a through ball. But he and the Clapton centre backs only got in a muddle, allowing Libock to loft in his second and Ealing's forth.

By this stage, the Tons fans singing and dancing was more to ward off hyperthermia than in realistic hope of pushing their team towards a result.

The ref blew up after an hour. The way things were going, another 30 would only have brought more misery.

Ealing had secured a come-from-behind 4-1 win that must have been sweet revenge for Clapton's come-from-behind 2-1 win at the start of the season.

With hindsight, the home side may rue not just taking the three points, but this is a team that wants to play and win football matches.

HISTORY

A Trip Down (Upton) Lane by Gary Price



On the 15th of February 1958, Clapton entertained Bromley at The Old Spotted Dog in the Isthmian League. Clapton in its 80th season were competing in the league for the 42nd consecutive season.

While Bromley formed in 1892 were in their 2nd spell in the league. They had spent 3 seasons in the Isthmian League from 1908 to 1911, winning the title in 1909 and 1910 before having their membership withdrawn in 1911. The Lilywhites re-entered the Isthmian from the Athenian League in 1952, and after finishing runners up in its 1st season back, went one better the following season.

The programme issued for the game followed a simple format, a sheet folded in half comprising of 4 pages. The front and back cover included details of Clapton's major honours, club officers, and adverts for local businesses in Forest Gate and Plaistow. The inner pages listed the teams, table and club notes. At the time Bromley and Clapton occupied 10th and 11th place respectively in the 16 team league.

Each side contained an England Amateur international. Clapton's Stan Homan gained his only cap keeping goal away to Switzerland B in 1957. Bromley's prolific striker Dennis Studley, gained his single cap scoring twice in a 5-0 defeat of Northern Ireland at Selhurst Park in 1954. Three weeks prior to the league encounter Bromley defeated Clapton 2-1 at The Dog in the 2nd round of the FA Amateur Cup. Two weeks later Clapton Reserves defeated their Bromley counterparts 6-4 at The Dog. The game was remembered for Ton trailing 4-1 at the break , scoring 4 goals in 4 minutes , to help register a notable victory.

Clapton gained revenge for the Amateur Cup defeat by defeating Bromley 3-2 on the 15th of February. This was also the day that the 5th round of the cup was due to be played.

A mile away, at The Boleyn, West Ham lost 3-2 to Fulham, but by the season's end had gained promotion to the 1st division. Sadly it was a 5th round that was overshadowed by the Munich Air Disaster that occurred on the 6th of February.

A chartered flight returning from Belgrade carrying 44 passengers and crew, including the Manchester United team, crashed on take off at Munich Riem Airport after a refuelling stop. Among the 23 fatalities were seven Manchester

United players returning from playing Red Star Belgrade in a European Cup quarter final. An 8th player Duncan Edwards, lost his fight for life on the 21st of February.

United were due to play Sheffield Wednesday at Old Trafford in the 5th round but the tie was postponed to the 19th to allow the club time to grieve and put together a patched up team. After defeating Wednesday 3-0, United lost controversially to Aston Villa in the FA Cup Final, beaten by Milan in the European Cup semi final and slipped from 2nd to 8th in the 1st division.

After beating Bromley, Clapton gained only one more win to finish 12th, five points clear of bottom club Romford.

Bromley improved to finish fourth, 11pts behind champions Tooting and Mitcham United. Tooting lost only 4 games, including a 1-0 loss at The Dog.

At Sandy Lane Tooting gained revenge by thrashing Clapton 7-2. Clapton suffered an even bigger defeat, losing at Woking 7-1.

For Clapton though, the season was to prove memorable for its FA Cup run. Ton battled past, St Albans City, Shefford Town, Ware, Enfield and Bury Town to reach the 1st round proper for the 1st time since 1928.

Clapton drawn at home to Football League 3rd division south QPR switched the tie to Ilford's Lynn Road ground, better equipped than The Dog to accomodate the expected crowd. On the day, 15,000 witnessed a 1-1 draw. A similar attendance saw Rangers beat Ton 3-1 in the replay at Loftus Road. Alas this was Clapton's last taste of glory in the FA Cup.

By the late 50's and early 60's Clapton's gradual decline continued culminating in last place league finishes in 1960 and 1961. In contrast, Bromley continued to improve, winning the title in 1961, defeating Clapton 6-0 at Hayes Lane and 2-1 at The Dog.

January 1949: Clapton FC minutes of 70 years ago by Chris Tymkow

They played on Christmas Day back then. Clapton had lost 2-3 at Woodford Town on 25th December, before beating Hendon 2-1 at home in the London Senior Cup on New Year's Day.

Two days later the Club Committee held its first meeting of 1949 at the Spotted Dog Ground.

Seasonal greetings had been received from Barking FC, Grays Athletic, Walthamstow Avenue, Oxford City, Walton & Hersham, and Haves FC among others.

The Secretary had sent the Club's congratulations to Stanley Rous at the FA [who was mentioned in the Archive article v Hutton FC], now Sir Stanley Rous, on his knighthood.

There was to be a Club Social in a few weeks' time at the Carnegie Library, Manor Park. (This fine building on Romford Road, Grade II listed, has recently re-opened as an Art space after being closed for some years).

A Public Dance at the Town Hall in Stratford was also planned for early March.

The Committee, which met every week during the season, was back the following Monday.

The First Team had beaten Harwich & Parkeston 3-0 in the 1st round of the Essex Cup on the Saturday, but it was felt that Clapton were getting poor coverage in the press, so it was agreed to seek out extra sites for posters "which would give more widespread publicity to our games".

An Easter Tour of Guernsey was also discussed. The official party was to consist of 14 players, 1 coach, 1 team attendant and the Secretary. Anyone else wishing to go would have to pay £12.10 each.

A 3-0 win away to Corinthian-Casuals in the Isthmian League formed the backdrop to the following week's meeting, when a second team coach was added to the Easter Tour list.

The Clapton FC Supporters' Association had a representative present, Mr Leete, who announced a donation from the Association of $\mathfrak{L}14$, which was appreciated.

The meeting of Monday 24 January discussed, among other things, the Club's allocation of tickets from the FA for the coming England v Scotland match at Wembley. Mr Solomon, a Committee member, got the two priced at 2 Guineas each, while the rest were to be distributed by ballot.

The final Committee meeting of January 1949, following a 3-1 league win at Walthamstow Avenue, noted that the Social in Manor Park had been a success and discussed arrangements for running an extension telephone line to the Spotted Dog Ground via a house in Disraeli Road.

The Club's bank balance, with weekly variations, was around the £50 mark.





FC STAR LONDON 1001NFNTC

Today we welcome Romanian heritage side FC Star London to the Stray Dog for Clapton Community's first ever Walthamstow league derby.

The visitors play at the Peter May Sports Centre, just a goal kick in a stiff breeze away from our temporary home.

Founded in 2014, FC Star have only recently changed their name from AFC United.

In their previous guise, they finished third in this league last season, having won it the year before, their first in the Middlesex County Football League.

Unfortunately they were denied promotion due to issues over gaining FA Charter Standard status.

However, the 2018/9 campaign got off to a massively frustrating start due to delays in processing clearance for overseas players.

These same administrative holdups put back Vlad Bendovskyy and Bogdan Panescu's competitive debuts for the Tons, among others.

FC Star were unable to field a side at all, leaving them with no choice but to forfeit their first three games.

Since then, their results have lived up to their strong track record. In fact, in Star's three games when they have been allowed to take to the pitch, they are still unbeaten.

In November they downed Hereford Palace 5-1 and then Eastfield 1-0.

Their only game in December was a 3-3 home draw with Ealing Town, who comprehensively defeated Clapton before Christmas.

In spite of their unfortunate delayed start, FC Star player-secretary Bogdan Maties told us they are still aiming to repeat last season's top three finish.

The Tons will be popping over the North Circular for the return fixture on the 16th of March, by which time the league table should be much clearer.
