CLAPTON CFC RETURN TO league action today with a first ever clash with Brentford looking to put last week's penalty shoot-out heartbreak behind them.

The Tons played some of their finest football of the season in the cup behind closed doors at Leyton Orient Reserves and were unfortunate to lose after powering to a 2-0 lead.

Today's challenge couldn't get much tighter as the two clubs finished seventh and eighth in last season's abandoned table, though never actually met due to postponements.

The Bees are managed by Karleigh Osborne, who previously played for their men's team as well as Bristol City, Millwall and Wimbledon. This season they are separated only by alphabetical order – both teams having won 3 so far, and with an identical 6-5 goal difference.

Brentford are cup specialists, too, having knocked Royal Wootton Bassett Ladies, two steps above, out of the FA Cup last month.

Last weekend, they beat Hounslow Reserves in the Capital Women's Cup while the Tons were suffering that defeat at Mile End Stadium.

Watch out for striker Kaitlyn Spencer-Dempsey, who has already bagged seven goals in seven games this season.

Equal in points and results, our first clash with the Bees should be a hotly contested fixture.

A second goal further dampened morale, but our misery was compounded shortly after, when Chelsie Osborne went down with a serious knee injury. It weighed heavy on our minds and the team struggled to recover, playing more with heart than with a game-plan. The 0-3 scoreline

was, in the end, a side-note on a pretty horrible day overall.
