

Shepherd's Bush was only founded in 2021 by prolific striker Aaron Morgan to be a centre of excellence for the best non-academy players.

In their debut season last year, they won the Middlesex County Football League Division One South & West title.

While four teams were promoted from the various divisions, Shepherd's Bush had the best record, winning 15 out of 20 games.

Their pre-season results this summer were impressive too. They beat our divisional rivals CB Hounslow United Reserves 10-2, drew with Step 5 side Edgware & Kingsbury Town 1-1 and lost only 5-1 to Step 3 Harrow Borough.

CCFC player-maanger Geoff Ocran said: "They are a bit of an unknown quantity so we will have to treat them with the utmost respect.

"As we have previously demonstrated before, there isn't a major difference between the steps at this level." Having been blitzed 4-2 by FC Soma last season on their first game at this level, we'll need to be on top form to prevent the same again.
