up with a superb performance in a 3-0 home win at the Old Spotted Dog Ground in March. Midfielder Ciara Monahan scored in both those games.

However, those two games didn't tell the full story of Whyteleafe's season. Their defeat at the OSD was their only loss in a 14-run spell. They were undefeated against eventual champions Dorking Wanderers twice - winning away, drawing at home. Meanwhile striker Abigail Woollvin was among the top scorers in the division with 18 goals.

Whyteeafe finished seventh last season, but just four points behind us in fourth. Ahead of this season's start, they've appointed Dulwich Hamlet Reserves manager Jack Badu to the top job.
