They have had two promotions on the bounce, including last season winning 20 of their 21 league matches, with 120 goals scored and just 19 conceded, to win the Surrey Premier Division, as well as the League Cup. Originally based in the village Nutfield in Surrey, they've moved to groundshare at Dorking Wanderers' ground this season. The Ashmount name was inspired by the chair and vice-chair's college in the United States with Leigh in honour of the grandfather of their club secretary.
