OUR LAST FA VASE GAME WAS IN OUR debut Step 7 Season at Wivenhoe and we gave a good account of ourselves despite playing higher opposition. FA Cup and FA Vase games are always reminders of where the club has ascended to and they will continue to be big events in the calendar for us.

Last season, there wasn't much separating the sides with a 0-0 draw and a 1-0 win away from home, so I don't envisage it being too different today. However, getting to the next round of the Vase for the first time would be a great morale booster after the last run of games with 2 defeats in 3.

Disappointingly, we've only taken 3 points from 9 which has seen us just drop out the playoffs positions. Narrow defeats to Croydon and Forest Hill Park, who we expect to be promotion rivals are part of our education as we adjust and evolve as a new team and squad.

The Forest Hill Park game was more of a performance we should expect being away from Home. Being resolute for long periods and creating good opportunities to score, but you do have to concentrate for the whole game and we unfortunately switched off for the second goal.

The cup competitions create a good distraction and we want to have a cup run this season, which can allow us to both utilise the squad and create momentum for the league games.

So we are not far away from where we would want to be and we would rather hit a level of form as the season heads towards the business end rather than run out of steam like the end of last season. Let's make history again today!

THEY WORE THE SHIRT: NICK LOBLACK

WHEN ANGUILLA DEFEATED TURKS and Caicos Islands recently in the CONCACAF Nations League it was only its third victory in 72 competitive matches and first since 2010 when Saint Martin were beaten in the Caribbean Cup. At the heart of the Anguilla defence in that match was former CCFC player Nick Loblack making his international debut at the age of 36. Nick played the full 90 minutes helping his team to a 2-0 victory and only its fourth clean sheet in competitive football.

Nick, a teacher by profession, joined us from Clapton FC after appearing in the Legends match at The Stray Dog in May 2019. His debut came in the third match of the 2019/20 season at Wivenhoe Town in The FA Vase, where he was deployed as an emergency striker. The higher ranked Eastern Counties League South hosts raced into a two goal lead before Nick reduced the arrears before half-time. Three unanswered second half goals ended interest in our debut in the competition.

Nick went on to make <u>16 league</u> and <u>cup</u> <u>appearances</u> during the Covid-curtailed 2019/20 season, his 11 league appearances realising only one defeat, with six of those matches ending in victory.

In August 2020 Nick announced that he was moving to Dubai to further his career. Four years later when informed of his international call-up: "I am still pinching myself".

A far cry from his last CCFC appearance, a dour 1-1 draw with Cricklewood Wanderers behind closed doors at the Match Day Centre in Walthamstow, days before the MCFL declared the season null and void.

OUR SECOND FA VASE STINT

We debuted in the FA Vase our second season, 2019/20, having just been promoted to Step 7. We lost 5-1 away to Wivenhoe Town, who were top of the division above, the Eastern Counties League Division One South, at the time. HODDESDON TOWN FC

FA VASE

HODDESDON TOWN WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1879 and started playing at its current Low Field ground in 1882. The highlight of the club's history must be winning the FA Vase at Wembley in front of 9500 spectators in the competition's first ever season, 1974/75.

In recent seasons they've flitted between the Essex Senior League and the Spartan South Midlands League but were relegated from the latter to the Eastern Counties League Division One two seasons ago.


We played The Lilywhites in two very tight games in the Eastern Counties League last season, drawing 0-0 at home and winning 1-0 away.

FORM GUIDE

After a decent tenth placed finish last season, four behind CCFC, Hoddesdon have improved further this season, sitting just outside the play-offs. That's despite having played the first 10 games of the season away as their ground is shared with the town's cricket team. Some eye-catching wins include 4-0 away at Cannons Wood and 3-1 at Dunmow Town.

HODDESDON HERE IN 1885

Hoddesdon Town may have one of the longest connections with the Old Spotted Dog Ground of any team around today. It was 139 years ago when the club, then known simply as Hoddesdon, came here to play a friendly against the ground's then resident team, St. Bartholomew's Hospital FC.

On Saturday 24th October 1885, in 'very squally weather', St. Bartholomew's Hospital gained a 2-0 victory. The home win came courtesy of a rugby-like 'combined rush' of its forwards in the first half, from which John Lemon put the ball in, followed by a goal from Walter Kayess. Hoddesdon made a comeback in the second half, hitting both the post and the crossbar, but didn't manage to score.

St. Bartholomew's Hospital's two goalscorers are worth further notice. Walter Kayess because his goal was something of a rarity, since he was normally the team's goalkeeper. But Hoddesdon's own goalie was simply named 'Another', implying that their regular keeper hadn't turned up. So the hospital may have put Edward Lemon, normally an outfielder, between the sticks out of a sense of fairness.

John Lemon is interesting because, firstly, he was Edward Lemon's younger brother, and secondly because the season before, when he was only about 17 years old, he had scored three of eight goals in a home thrashing of Upton Park FC. That must give John Lemon a claim to be one of the youngest players to have scored a hat-trick in a senior match at the Old Spotted Dog Ground.

Hoddesdon hitting the bar is also noteworthy. The first mention of crossbars at the Old Spotted Dog Ground had only been the season before. Previous to that, there was probably just a tape strung across from the tops of the goalposts.

The teams were as follows, Hoddesdon employing a six-strong front line in which Webster was singled out for praise; while St. Bartholomew's, who had sometimes played that way in their early days, lined up with five up front and a midfield of three.
