The current Herne Bay women's team formed in 2012 in the South East Counties Women's Football League. Three successive promotions saw them reach the London & South East Regional Women's League Premier Division (tier 5) where they stayed for three seasons before dropping back down to Division One South. Due to a summer restructure they now find themselves laterally moved to the North division. They play their home games at Winch's Field, the same stadium as the men's team in the Isthmian League.

Form guide

Over the summer, The Bay have beaten Margate 6-1, drawn 2-2 with Tonbridge Angels but lost 9-0 defeat away to QPR (who play a level higher). Last season they finished 9th while we were 7th so we should be well matched. They also had a decent run in the FA Cup, beating Margate and Sutton United before a narrow defeat to QPR.

Player/s to watch

Most of last season's squad have signed up for the new challenge in the north despite what presumably will be longer journeys. That includes joint top scorers Steph Adby and Ysobele Demomme, the latter of whom scored a hat-trick last weekend.

NEW SIGNINGS

A silky smooth attacker, Leigha Bradding-Butler joins us after playing for Bloomfield College in New Jersey and (closer to home) Billericay Town in the Women's National League Division One South East. She joined CCFC because of the "inclusive community and good vibes right from the first trial" and scored a great goal in the friendly against Haringey Borough.

Ella Bowles is a brave and agile young goalkeeping talent. She has been an ever-present in our friendlies, earning a deserved first clean sheet against Comets last week. We have the strong Clapton Community presence among staff and students at her school to thank for encouraging her to join.

Ella previously played at London Seaward and Camden Town, for whom she made her FA Cup debut last season. She's also been to St George's Park to meet and train with the England squad.

WHO'S IN THE DIVISION
