Formed by two childhood friends during the first lockdown in 2020, Hammersmith FC have been dubbed 'the Wrexham of grassroots football' and 'London's most elegant club'. Among their sponsors are Chase & Status and Kappa while former Lionesses star Eni Aluko has helped them out. Their men's first team has enjoyed success in the Southern Amateur League and their women's first team have secured three promotions in four seasons. Their long-term aims are to reach the national leagues, add in a youth set-up and secure their own stadium - they're currently playing home games at Gunnersbury Park.

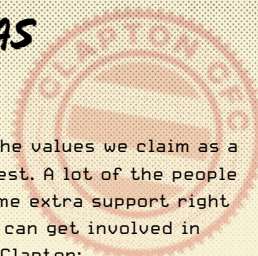

WHEN ARSENAL RELEGATED VILLA HERE

The 1995-96 Women's Premier League headed for its conclusion with Arsenal in third position, 10 points behind leaders Doncaster Belles.

The Gunners beat rock-bottom Wolves 9-0 on Sunday, April 20, their biggest win of the season. The very next day Arsenal turned up at the Old Spotted Dog Ground for a 1pm 'home' match against Villa Aztecs.

Programme notes were provided by Arsenal's Secretary/Physio Vic Akers, who lamented the injuries during the season that

had lost them Gill Wylie, Michelle Curley, Marianne Spacey and Sharon Barber. But incoming Jo Broadhurst had been a big plus, along with Clare Wheatley. Both were named in a Gunners squad that notched up a 4-1 victory.

Arsenal moved up to second place, but with no chance of catching Doncaster. In contrast Villa Aztecs - since renamed as Aston Villa - were condemned to relegation by their defeat at the Old Spotted Dog.
