Actonians LFC was founded in 1998 as Chiswick United, before becoming Acton Sports Club four seasons later and then in 2008 part of historic men's club Old Actonians. The women's first team are in the fourth tier and have recently moved to groundshare at North Greenford United. Their reserves team play at Gunnersbury Park and have been in this division at tier six for three seasons. This season, the club made the name change from Actonians Ladies to Actonians Women.

Form guide

Since our last meeting in November, they've won 3, drawn away at high-flying Camden Town and lost just once to title challengers Bromley. Last week they took league leaders Hammersmith to extra time in the cup, but lost on penalties.

Previous meetings

It's one win apiece so far this season. The away league game in October ended up a 3-1 defeat, but a few weeks later we gained revenge 3-0 in the cup. Over the years it's been three wins, three losses and one draw in our meetings.

Players to watch

Katy Hanscomb is the division's second top scorer with 21 goals already this season - with Holly Reid in fourth with 13.

WOMEN'S HEAD COACH

Good afternoon and welcome back to the Old Spotted Dog. We weren't at our best last Sunday, so we're looking forward to a turnaround today. It's a tough time of the season - we're out of all the cups, we're trying to stay motivated to fight for fourth place... how exciting. It would be easy to shrug our shoulders and let a loss like last Sunday fall out of mind, but I admire this team for how much they feel every loss. They're never satisfied or complacent. They're self aware and hungry to improve every match. And by all evidence they are more than ready to mob up for Ella when called.

Clapton's at an interesting crossroads. In some ways, this team needs to decide who it wants to be. I think the same can be said for other teams and the club itself. For example, the W1T is only one of two teams in our league that doesn't train twice a week. To get promoted, we'd probably need to start, but we can't afford another 5-figure cost to rent the pitch space. The M1T is one of the few teams in its league that doesn't compensate players in some way. Can they survive in the league above without that recruitment tool in their pocket?

Take it wider: can we sustain our ties to the community, our commitments to youth football, without a pitch they can train on? Can we celebrate being nominated for an award by Football v Homophobia while choosing to remain in FA affiliated leagues that discriminate against trans players? They're difficult questions to answer. The implications of those answers could be huge. I do think we're reaching a point where we can't ignore the questions.
