DULWICH HAMLET RES

Welcome to today's visiting players, coaches, supporters and officials

AFC Phoenix formed in 2010 and its first and reserves teams quickly rose up the divisions. In 2018 they merged to become Dulwich Hamlet. Both teams have had a further promotion since, with the first team in the fourth tier since 2023/4, while the reserves joining the sixth tier in 2020/21.

Dulwich are in eighth in the table, three places and six points behind us, but with two games in hand.

Previous meetings

This will be the eleventh meeting. The last was three weeks ago, when Dulwich won 1-0. The most memorable was last May, in the league cup final at Maidstone United's Gallagher Stadium. With Clapton 2-0 up, the ref and a home official decided to abandon the game due to the presence of a Palestine flag and banner. A subsequent FA statement said the game should not have been abandoned, but it was not replayed. Of the ten games played to completion, Dulwich have the upper hand with five wins to our two, with three draws.

Players to watch

Top scorer Shakirra Sesay has 15 this season. Speedy winger Natalia Davila, who played four games for us two seasons ago, is their second top scorer.

As we prepare to face Dulwich Hamlet Reserve Team once again, we do so with a mixture of determination and reflection. It's only been a few weeks since our last meeting, where we narrowly lost 1-0 in a hard-fought contest. That result still lingers, not as a frustration, but as motivation. We know what we're capable of, and today is another opportunity to show it.

Encounters with Dulwich sides always carry a little extra meaning for us. Many will remember last season's cup final against Dulwich Hamlet, a match that was halted after just 20 minutes. While the football stopped, something more important took centre stage - visible, vocal support for Palestine. It was a reminder that our game does not exist in isolation from the world around it.

As a club, we remain proud of our willingness to stand for something beyond results and league tables. Football is powerful, but so too is solidarity. The willingness to make small sacrifices - to pause, to speak, to act - defines who we are just as much as anything that happens on the pitch.
