CAMDEN TOWN WFC

Welcome to today's visiting players, coaches, supporters and officials

Camden Town WFC are one of the oldest independent women's football clubs in London, formed in 1986. Their owner wants to reach the WSL and this summer they opened up to new investment, with the club valued at £500,000 and lots of major sponsors. It's been so far so good with three promotions in five years though last season they just missed out on another, finishing third behind Hammersmith and Bromley. Home games are at Wingate & Finchley's Maurice Rebak Stadium.

Form guide

It's been four wins so far this season - two in the FA Cup, two in the league - scoring 20 goals and conceding none.

Previous meetings

Camden won both games last season. They won an exciting game at the Old Spotted Dog Ground in December 2-1 through an injury time penalty. In the return match in February, it was a 3-0 home win, despite Camden having a player sent off.

Player/s to watch

20 of last season's Camden squad have been retained and they've added half a dozen new signings. We usually pick out the opposition's top scorers but given they haven't conceded a goal this season, a shout out to goalkeeper Tamsin Wickens instead.

WOMEN'S FIRST TEAM HEAD COACH

Welcome back to the Old Spotted Dog. It's been a while since we played here, and it's good to have a proper crowd behind us again.

Sunday's a special one off the pitch too. Members from across the club are getting their photos taken for the Clapton sticker book, and after the final whistle Nawty Nicky is DJing so everyone can stick around and dance. Camden are welcome to stay for a drink with us afterwards as well. That's the kind of club we are, win or lose.

On the pitch, we go into this off the back of our best result of the season. Six-three away at AFC Welwyn in the FA Cup, with Emily Link scoring a hat-trick, Maria Mendonca getting two and Marta Boiro one. That performance ended a run of three one-goal defeats to start the campaign, and it's given the squad something to build from.

Camden are a different test. They've won every game so far this season without conceding, and they were close to promotion last year. They beat us twice last season too, both games tight, one settled by a stoppage-time penalty. So we know what they're capable of and we know what we need to do differently.

We're not going into this looking to just compete. We want to take the momentum from Welwyn and turn it into our first league points of the season, in front of our own fans, on our own ground. That's the aim today.

NOT THEN, NOT NOW: UNITE THE UNION MARKS 90 YEARS OF ANTIFASCIST HISTORY

Mr Harris Greenberg lived at 6 Plashet Road, just a few minutes' walk from the **Old Spotted Dog**. On 11 September 1935 at 8.30pm, Greenberg heard a loud thump and the crash of broken glass. Dashing downstairs, he found glass everywhere, his living room window put through by a rock. He rushed outside to find a neighbour had already caught the culprit by knocking him off his bicycle as he tried to escape. Greenberg immediately recognised Blackshirt George Rivers, a local fascist who had caused him trouble before. Rivers was arrested, fined and imprisoned for 13 days, but it wouldn't stop him, and anyway there were hundreds more of Oswald Mosley's footsoldiers in London. This was the day-to-day experience of fascism that working class people - especially Jews, communists and trade unionists - faced in the late 1930s.

Of course, the working class was more than capable of defending itself from the fascist threat, and clashes with Mosley's British Union of Fascists (BUF) became fiercer and more frequent during the course of 1936. All over the country, fascist meetings were disrupted, and outdoor rallies broken up by the organised working class who had no time for the aristocratic Mosley, his divisive message or the uniformed thugs he brought with him. Major BUF events were countered in Aberdeen, Barnsley, Edinburgh, Hull, Leeds, Manchester, Rotherham, Tonypany



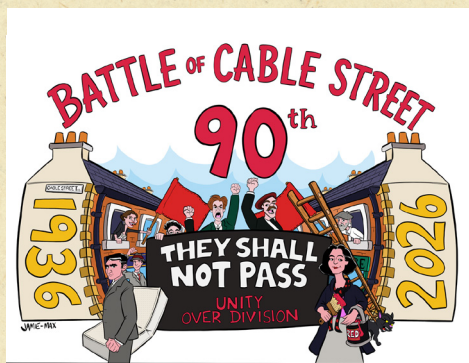
and many more towns and cities. As the horrors of Nazism were becoming more obvious in Germany, and Spain was engulfed by a fascist military coup in July 1936, the urgency of stopping Mosley's movement was clear. Indeed, many of those who went on to fight fascism as volunteers in Spain, and all across Europe after 1939, had their first experience of antifascism in the streets of their home towns in Britain.

The crescendo at the end of this long summer of antifascist resistance was of course the **Battle of Cable Street**, on Sunday 4 October 1936, when **working class Londoners prevented the fascists marching through the Jewish East End**. People flooded the streets, with the lowest estimate putting the numbers at more than 100,000. The crowds of ordinary Londoners - Jews, Irish dockers, trade unionists, communists, socialists - resisted baton charges by the police who were unable to clear a route through the streets for Mosley's 5,000 Blackshirts. Famously, barricades were raised along Cable Street, one painted with the slogan **"They Shall Not Pass"**... and they didn't. >

THE BATTLE OF CABLE STREET



We are fast approaching the ninetieth anniversary of this iconic event. This is especially important because the parallels between now and then feel stronger than at any time in recent memory. A populist right spearheaded by demagogues from the wealthy elite, drawing in working class members with a vision of easy answers to complex problems, scapegoating minorities, and with murky overseas funding and a determination to weaken organised labour - that could be describing Mosley's movement or something at play in the UK right now. When we see pogroms in Belfast and columns of black-clad men enacting paramilitary cosplay in the streets of Glasgow, it is impossible not to see echoes of the 1930s.

Of course, when fascism is defeated, it doesn't stay beaten. Mosley reemerged after the war, and a new generation of antifascists led by Jewish ex-servicemen defeated his movement again. In the 1970s, Mosley's political heirs in the National Front targeted a later wave of migrants, and the new Bengali community in East London had to organise to protect itself. The strength of fascism ebbs and flows. Every generation has its own struggle to defend a united working class, and in 2026 we face a powerful new mutation of fascism. That's why Unite the union is playing a major role in this year's commemoration events:

MATCH REPORT

06.09.26 – CLAPTON CFC WIT

3-6 Clapton CFC win against AFC Welwyn

Clapton CFC kicked off their Women's FA Cup campaign winning a nine-goal thriller against a strong AFC Welwyn side.

The competition carries significant history for our club, due to the 2021/22 season heroics in becoming the first seventh-tier club in history to reach the Third Round.

Nowadays we're sixth tier, so too are AFC Welwyn having been promoted in their first season without losing a single game.

The visitors got off to an electric start at the University of Hertfordshire campus in Hatfield, taking the lead after just three minutes when Emily Link slotted into the corner.

CCFC goalkeeper Ella Bowles was called into action shortly after, pulling off two sharp saves to protect the early advantage before Link doubled the lead in the 10th minute by out-sprinting the defence and finishing with composure.

Midway through the half, summer signing Flo Hobbes saw her impressive debut cut short following a heavy collision, to be replaced by Annie Lyons.

Clapton extended their lead in spectacular style shortly before the break when Marta Boiro unleashed a dipping strike from thirty yards out into the top corner.

However, Welwyn grabbed one back before half-time, steered home from close range after Bowles had initially saved a deflected free kick.

3-1 at half-time didn't feel entirely comfortable, and Welwyn started the second half with renewed intensity. They clawed it back to 3-2 quickly, with a thumping strike into the corner.

Welwyn would have fancied continuing their comeback but Clapton responded through Maria Mendonca, who worked hard to force home her own rebound for her first goal of the season.

In the 66th minute, Clapton adjusted their shape as Noora Oikarainen came on at right back for Boiro, allowing Lucy Spours to push forward into midfield. Spours immediately made her presence felt, unlocking the opposition defence to set up Mendonca for her second.

Allana Scoble saw a long-range shot tipped onto the cross bar which would have been a fitting reward for a player of the match performance.

Welwyn were awarded a penalty for a handball against Li Steiner after the ball bounced up and hit her hand. Bowles got a hand to the spot kick, but the power carried it into the net.

That made it 5-3 but realistically it was too late for Welwyn now with the game deep in stoppage time. There was time for another goal, but it was for Clapton. Scoble set up Link to place her finish neatly into the bottom corner, completing her first hat-trick since October 2024.

Clapton CFC advance to the Second Round Qualifying, where yet another away tie awaits them against Chelmsford City.

After a disappointing start to the season thus far, Clapton will be hoping for a memorable cup run that could also kickstart the league campaign.

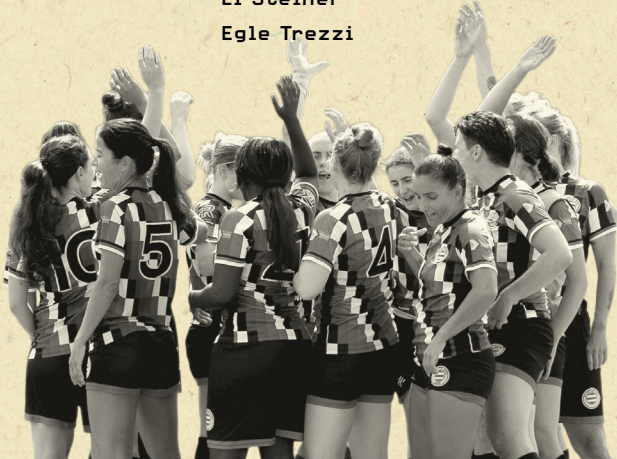
